NOTE: The Early Head Start program serves pregnant women, beginning any time during pregnancy, and children up to the age of three (3) in selected service areas. Early Head Start children may transition to Head Start at the chronological age of three (3) and also receive priority for placement. Children with disabilities and an IEP are age eligible to apply for Head Start services as of their third birthday, in accordance with ACYF-IM-94-16. Chronological 3-year-old children may be enrolled to fill a vacancy in the middle of the school year per OHS-PC-I-001 and with direction and approval from ERSEA Specialist(s).

Family means all persons living in the household who are supported by the child's parents(s)' or guardians(s)' income; and are related to the child's parent(s) or guardian(s) by blood, marriage, or adoption; or are the child authorized caregiver or legally responsible party.

INCOME GUIDELINES

(c) *Eligibility requirements*. (1) A pregnant woman or a child is eligible if: (i) The family's income is equal to or below the poverty line; or, (ii) The family is eligible for or, in the absence of child care, would be potentially eligible for public assistance; including TANF child-only payments, or, (iii) The child is homeless, as defined in part 1305; or, (iv) The child is in foster care.

Public assistance includes Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
